Did you miss graduating from high school due to military service in World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, or internment in a World War II relocation camp?

You may be eligible to receive a high school diploma from the Sacramento County Board of Education.

Operation Recognition, a Sacramento County Office of Education program, will present high school diplomas to those in our community whose high school education was interrupted due to wartime circumstances.

QUALIFICATIONS ARE:

- ✓ Served in the U.S. military in World War II, Korea or Vietnam with honorable discharge *or* ✓ Interned in a Japanese American relocation camp during World War II

and

- ✓ Currently reside in Sacramento County or attended a high school in Sacramento County prior to enlistment or internment

IF YOU HAVE A QUALIFYING FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS NOW DECEASED, YOU MAY APPLY FOR POSTHUMOUS RECOGNITION.

THERE IS NO CHARGE TO PARTICIPATE IN OPERATION RECOGNITION.
